

## **Water Resources Infrastructure (U.S. Army Corps of Engineers)**

**Total Funding Available:** \$2 Billion, awarded nationally by the Corps

### **Overview:**

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers announced project awards on April 28, 2009. There was no opportunity for local governments to submit new projects; instead, the Corps conducted an internal review of existing and ongoing projects and made allocations to those projects.

According to a Corps press release, “The projects selected represent a set of productive investments that will contribute to economic development and aquatic ecosystem restoration. Consistent with congressional guidance that the Corps’ allocation of Recovery Act funds maximize national benefits, the Corps made its allocation of Recovery Act construction funds based on the economic and environmental return of its ongoing projects.” (emphasis added)
