We'll also explore what happens when an employee remains out of work for an extended period, including leave considerations, accommodation discussions, Maximum Medical Improvement (MMI), and the steps that may lead to claim closure. Municipal employers must navigate the overlapping requirements of the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA), the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), workers' compensation statutes, and local leave policies, all while minimizing employment practices liability. This session will examine common compliance pitfalls, emerging risk areas, and real-world scenarios that create exposure to discrimination, retaliation, interference, and failure-to-accommodate claims.
